Dr. Dickerson will address the often daunting task of working with couples who are mired in conflict. She will use a combination of exercises, role-play interviews and consultations with workshop participants to apply therapeutic concepts. Particular attention will be given to issues on how power, privilege and cultural forces blind couples in their relationship; to what captures them and prevents them from relating to each other in preferred ways.

In this two-day workshop participants will learn a template for understanding how to work with their clients. The focus will be on noticing power differentials and invisible privilege that affect the couple.

The group will be exposed to not only a map for working with couples but also skill practice. This will allow participants to notice their thinking in the work as well as how to put it into action. It is hoped that attendees will return to clinical practice with a renewed sense of interest in couples work.



Victoria Dickerson, Ph.D., is currently in private practice in Los Gatos, California and is an adjunct lecturer in the master's program in clinical psychology at San José State University. She travels nationally and internationally to give workshops in Narrative ideas and practices and continues to write about the narrative approach. She is the widely published co-author of the seminal work *If Problems Talked: Narrative Therapy in Action* and most recently *Who Cares What You're Supposed to Do? Breaking the Rules to Get What You Want in Love, Life, and Work*.
